## **Synopsis:**

Singery's vehicle was observed by witnesses Darl and Mary McAllister being driven in an erratic manner. Mary McAllister utilized her cell phone to call 911. Off-duty Deputy Brigham also saw the erratically driven vehicle and advised the McAllisters to tell the Dispatchers he was also behind the car. Deputy Brigham contacted the driver, Singery, at 4th and Percival, and identified himself with his badge and instructed her to shut off the engine. Instead, she sped away and was followed to 5th and Capitol where her car bumped witness Bisher's car from behind as Olympia Police cars arrived. Singery submitted to field sobriety tests, was taken into custody pursuant to observations of her speech, demeanor, balance, odor of alcoholic beverages, etc., and transported to the Olympia Police Department for D.U.I. processing.

## **Investigation**

In addition to the investigation already conducted by patrol officers (see reports by Officers Allen, Henry, and Rainier), I recontacted witnesses Darl and Mary McAllister as well as Witness Bisher.

The McAllisters advised they were southbound on I-5 and had encountered a vehicle traveling the wrong way in the inside lane near 14th, and that they had called this incident in to 911. They said that a few minutes later while westbound Hwy 101 they noticed the (Singery) vehicle ahead of them weaving in and out of its lane. They then reported this to 911 and followed the Singery vehicle off the 101 Freeway to Black Lake Boulevard.

As they were on the phone, another vehicle occupied by a off-duty deputy pulled up next to them. Deputy Brigham identified himself, verified that the McAllisters were talking to 911, and asked that it be relayed to 911 that he was also behind the Singery vehicle.

Brigham then pulled ahead of the McAllisters and behind the Singery vehicle. They followed the Singery vehicle to North 4th Avenue. At a stop sign, the deputy started to get out to talk to the driver of the Singery vehicle, but it left before he could do so. The deputy then followed and placed his car ahead of the Singery

vehicle. At another stop sign, the deputy made contact with the driver and showed her his badge and spoke with her directly, but she sped away at a high rate of speed. They followed the car to 5th Avenue and Capital Way where it was involved in a minor traffic collision. At this point the Olympia Police intervened.

When I originally spoke with the McAllisters, they advised that the wrong-way vehicle on the freeway was another car. They could not describe the wrong-way vehicle, but based on the two different locations, they felt it was another vehicle. After reading the article in *The Olympian* where Ms. Singery/Romero admits to being the wrong-way vehicle on the freeway, the McAllisters, according to Mary, have a divided opinion as to whether it was the same vehicle. Mr. McAllister believes it was not the same vehicle. Mrs. McAllister believes the Singery vehicle could have been the same vehicle as the wrong-way vehicle that had been stopped, or nearly stopped, next to the median. Mrs. McAllister feels that while they were preoccupied with the 911 call, the car could have made a U-turn and then passed their car on SR 101.

I also spoke with Witness Bisher who said he was stopped at the red light at 5th at Capitol when he was struck from behind by the (Singery) vehicle. He said that he did not mention it that night, but said his neck was now sore and that he was planning on seeing a doctor. Since no accident report was originally taken, Mr. Bisher later went to Olympia Police Department and Officer Carlson took a police collision report (see attached).

Concerning the possible hit-and-run: I spoke with Sgt. Jim Greene of the Washington State Patrol, as well as Trooper Chad Johnson who was working that night. There is no record of a hit-and-run accident having been reported on the freeway. Trooper Johnson advises he did check for the wrong-way vehicle, but it was not located.

I ordered a tape of the phone-radio traffic of this event. Olympia Police Department secretary Teresa Gypin transcribed the 911 phone traffic (see attached).

This report is to be referred to O.M.C. Prosecutor's Office.

CONTINUATION REPORT  
OFFICER R. ALLEN

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On 6-16-96 at 2246 hrs Dispatch received three calls of a small red or maroon vehicle going n/b in the s/b lanes of I-5 in the area of Plum St. All of these calls were forwarded to WSP and neither dispatch center obtained the names of the various callers.

At 2251 hrs. Dispatch advised that an off-duty TCSO Deputy was behind a small maroon vehicle that had come off the freeway and was heading n/b on Black Lake Blvd passing the Good Guys Store. Based on the driving pattern, the Deputy believed this to be a DUI. The Deputy, Deputy Brigham, was in his personal car with his family, and talking to dispatch with his cellular phone. Dispatch further stated that Deputy Brigham was following the vehicle n/b on Black Lake Blvd, then e/b on 4th Av. W. Per dispatch, the female driver of the vehicle (401FFE), noticed that Deputy Brigham was following her, and when she was at 4th Av. W. and Percival St. she stopped the car, exited and fled on foot. The driver returned to her car, drove around the Deputy's car, which was parked in front of her to block her in, and proceeded e/b on 4th Av W. at a high rate of speed. She continued e/b on 4th Av., then e/b on 5th Av to downtown Olympia. The vehicle came to rest at 5th Av. and Capital Way when she was stopped by Officer Rainer after she rear-ended a car who was stopped for the light at 5th and Capital Way (e/b).

I contacted Officer Rainer who was detaining the female, later id'd as A/Singery, on the sidewalk. As I spoke with A/Singery, I observed that she was having trouble keeping her balance, and was

swaying in a circular motion. I detected a strong odor of intoxicants about A/Singery's person and asked her if she had been drinking. A/Singery replied that she had a glass of wine several hours prior.

When asked, A/Singery said that she knew the alphabet and could recite it without singing. A/Singery did recite the alphabet, but it was very fast, some of the letters were slurred together and she sang it.

I then asked if A/Singery had any medical problems with her legs, knees, or any other problem that would prevent her from doing a balance test. A/Singery said that her "butt" was tired from riding a bicycle earlier in the day, but she had no other problems.

I instructed A/Singery to stand with her heels together, hands down at her sides, and to stay in this position until I get done explaining/demonstrating the balance test. A/Singery could not stay in this position for more than a couple of seconds. She began to fall backwards and had to step back and move her arms out to her sides away from her legs to gain her balance. I told A/Singery that I wanted her to put one foot flat on the ground (she could choose the foot) and raise the other foot approx 6" off the ground, keeping her legs straight and her arms down to her sides touching her hips, while counting out loud to fifteen. I then demonstrated this test. A/Singery attempted this test four times. Each time she would count very fast and get to number "5", where she would start to fall backwards and have to put her foot down to catch her balance. On one attempt, she fell back so fast, that Officer



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Rainer, who was standing along side her, had to catch her and help her regain her balance. A/Singery then stated that , "you got me, I can't do it."

The last test I had A/Singery perform was the walk and turn test. I told A/Singery to stand with one foot in front of the other, touching heel to toe, with her arms down to her sides and to stay like that while I gave her the instructions for the test. A/Singery attempted to stand like this once, and when she began to fall down, said , "I can't do that", and stood with her feet apart in a normal posture. I told A/Singery to take 8 steps down the sidewalk (straight and level), touching heel to toe each time, in a straight line, and count out loud each step. After taking 8 steps down, she was to turn around in any way she choose, and take 8 steps back to me following the same instructions. A/Singery began to walk down the sidewalk, attempting to walk in a straight line, but her steps were approx 7" apart and she was not counting the steps out loud. I stopped A/Singery and reminded her that she was to touch her feet heel to toe, and to count the steps out loud. I then gave her the opportunity to start this test over again. A/Singery did start the test over again, but continued to keep her feet approx 7" apart and still did not count out loud. A/Singery's footsteps got wider apart the further down the line she got, and didn't even attempt to walk in a straight line any more. I had to tell A/Singery to turn around after she had taken 15 steps. When she turned around she began to sway her hips back and forth, moving her arms in the same manner, and started to dance down the line

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back to me.

I placed A/Singery under arrest for DUI and placed her in the back seat of my patrol car.

I then contacted Deputy Brigham who was still at the scene. Deputy Brigham said that he will be filing a report with his agency about this incident and gave me a business card of a witness who had also observed her driving pattern. This witness, W/McAllister, left the scene prior to my being able to interview him. I attempted to contact him by telephone with negative results.

Officer D. Libby contacted the driver of the vehicle that A/Singery struck at Capital Way. Officer Libby advised that this was a non-reportable accident, and sent this driver, W/Bisher, away from the scene prior to me contacting him.

While at then scene, WSP Trooper<sup>(J) 301720</sup> contacted me. He advised that he was on the freeway attempting to locate the wrong way vehicle when he was told by a witness that the wrong way vehicle had struck a white vehicle on the freeway and fled the scene. The Trooper examined A/Singery's vehicle and said that he observed damage and paint transfer on her vehicle that was consistent with what the witness had told him. At the time of this report WSP was still investigating this incident.

A/Singery's vehicle was left secured at the scene per her request. She was then transported down to OPD.

While at OPD, I explained my PC for A/Singery's arrest to Officer Henry who contacted her and administered the BAC test.

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A/Singery refused this test. See Officer Henry's follow-up for further details.

A/Singery was booked into OPD jail for DUI and pr'd.

No other information at this time.

AT ABOUT 2257 ON 061696 I WAS ON REGULAR PATROL IN A MARKED POLICE VEHICLE ASSIGNED TO THE DOWN TOWN AREA. DISPATCH ADVISED THAT AN OFF DUTY DEPUTY SHERIFF WAS FOLLOWING A POSSIBLE DUI SUBJECT IN A RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE ON HENDERSON. DISPATCH ADVISED THAT THE OFF DUTY DEPUTY SHERIFF WAS STOPPED AND OUT WITH THE SUBJECT. DISPATCH ADVISED THAT THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE WAS FLEEING THE SCENE IN THE DIRECTION OF THE TWO BRIDGES TO DOWN TOWN, 4TH AND 5TH AVE.

I PLACED MY PATROL VEHICLE AT 4TH AVE AND WATER WAITING FOR THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE TO PASS. SGT PARTIN, OFFICER D. LIBBY, AND OFFICER ALLEN WERE RESPONDING TO THE AREA.

DISPATCH ADVISED THAT THE DEPUTY WAS FOLLOWING THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE DOWN THE 5TH AVE BRIDGE. I TURNED ON MY EMERGENCY LIGHTS AND FOLLOWED THE DEPUTY'S VEHICLE. THE DEPUTY'S VEHICLE THEN PULLED OVER TO THE SIDE TO LET ME IN BEHIND THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE. THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE STOPPED BEHIND A VEHICLE AT A RED LIGHT AT 5TH AND CAPITOL. I STARTED TO GET OUT OF MY PATROL VEHICLE, WHEN THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE DROVE FORWARD HITTING THE STOPPED VEHICLE IN FRONT OF IT. I ACTIVATED MY SIREN TO GET THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE TO STOP. I MOVED MY PATROL VEHICLE TO BLOCK THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE FROM LEAVING THE SCENE. SGT PARTIN AND OFFICER D. LIBBY ALSO PLACED THEIR MARKED PATROL VEHICLES IN FRONT OF THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE FROM LEAVING THE SCENE.

I CONTACTED THE DRIVER OF THE RED 1991 TOYOTA WA LICENSE #401FFE, A SANDRA JEAN SINGERY DOB: 052448. SINGERY HAD A STRONG ORDER OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE COMING FROM HER. I ESCORTED SINGERY TO THE SOUTHWEST SIDE WALK ON 5TH AND CAPITOL, BECAUSE SHE WAS UNSTEADY ON HER FEET.

I ASKED SINGERY IF SHE HAD DRANK ANY ALCOHOL TONIGHT.

SINGERY STATED THAT SHE HAD SOME.

I ASKED SINGERY TO PERFORM SOME FIELD SOBRIETY TEST. I ASKED SINGERY TO RECITE THE ALPHABET FROM A TO Z WITH OUT SINGING IT.

SINGERY STATED THAT SHE WOULD BE GLAD TO. SINGERY THEN JUST STARED OFF INTO THE DISTANCE WITHOUT RECITING THE ALPHABET.

I ASKED SINGERY TO RECITE THE ALPHABET AGAIN, FROM A TO Z WITH OUT SINGING IT.

SINGERY AGAIN SAID THAT SHE WOULD. SINGERY, HOWEVER DID NOT RECITE ANY OF THE ALPHABET.

I ASKED SINGERY A THIRD TIME TO RECITE THE ALPHABET FROM A TO Z WITHOUT SINGING IT.

SINGERY DID NOT SAY ANYTHING, SHE ACTED LIKE SHE WAS ASLEEP.


OFFICER ALLEN ASKED SINGERY TO RECITE THE ALPHABET FROM A TO Z WITHOUT SINGING IT.

SINGERY STATED THAT SHE WOULD. SINGERY STARTED TO SING THE ALPHABET.

OFFICER ALLEN ASKED SINGERY TO STAND ON ONE FOOT, WHILE HOLDING THE OTHER FOOT SIX INCHES OFF THE GROUND.

SINGERY TRIED, BUT WAS UNABLE TO STAND ON ONE FOOT. THIS CAUSED SINGERY TO LOSE HER BALANCE AND ALMOST FALL. SINGERY STATED "THAT IT YOU CAUGHT ME I BEEN DRINKING." SINGERY WAS UNABLE TO FINISH THE STAND ON ONE FOOT TEST.

OFFICER ALLEN ASKED SINGERY TO TURN AROUND AND ADVISED HER THAT SHE WAS UNDER ARREST FOR DUI.

6-16-96/ 2315 HRS. I WAS CONTACTED AT THE OLYMPIA POLICE DEPARTMENT BY OFFICER RICH ALLEN REGARDING A FEMALE HE HAD ARRESTED FOR DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED. OFFICER ALLEN IS NOT CERTIFIED TO RUN THE BREATH TEST UNDER THE IMPLIED CONSENT LAW, AND HE REQUESTED THAT I RUN THE FEMALE THROUGH THE TEST.

OFFICER ALLEN SAID THAT THE FEMALE, IDENTIFIED AS SANDRA JEAN SINGERY-ROMERO DOB/5-24-48, WAS BEING FOLLOWED BY AN OFF DUTY THURSTON COUNTY SHERIFF DEPUTY, WHO WAS CALLING IN VIA CELLULAR PHONE 911, THAT SINGERY WAS A DRUNK DRIVER AND HIT AND RUN SUSPECT. OFFICER ALLEN SAID THAT HE HAD STOPPED SINGERY AT 5TH AND CAPITAL AND DETERMINED THAT SHE WAS DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED. OFFICER ALLEN SAID THAT SINGERY WAS ARRESTED FOR DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED. SEE OFFICER ALLENS REPORT.

I THEN CONTACTED SINGERY AT THE OLYMPIA CITY JAIL. I ADVISED SINGERY WHY SHE WAS THERE, AND SINGERY SAID, "BUT I DIDN'T DO ANYTHING WRONG." On 16 June 96, at approximately 1100 pm I was off duty and traveling North bound on Hwy 101 near the Crosby Rd exit when I observed a Toyota Camry burgundy in color bearing Washington registration 401FFE also traveling North bound. I observed the vehicle driving in an erratic manner by crossing the double white line in lane number three then driving the vehicle to the fog line and crossing it also of lane number three. The vehicle continued to weave from the double white line to the fog line until the vehicle exited Hwy 101 at Blacklake Blvd. As the vehicle approached the intersection of Blacklake Blvd, I Observed the vehicle turn the corner wider than normal heading North bound on Blacklake Blvd. As the vehicle completed its turn onto Blacklake Blvd the vehicle almost hit the curb in front of Denny's. The Vehicle stopped at the signal at the intersection of Blacklake Blvd and Copper Point Rd and I noticed a citizen in a vehicle talking on a cellular telephone and looking at the Toyota Camry. I asked the citizen if she was talking to 911 and she stated yes. I identified myself as an off duty officer and requested she request an Olympia unit. I then continued to follow the subjects vehicle North bound on Blacklake Blvd. The subjects vehicle continued to weave between the white line of lane number two and the curb. The vehicle was also driving approximately 20 m.p.h. in a posted 35 m.p.h. zone. As the vehicle approached the intersection of Blacklake Blvd and 4th Ave the vehicle stopped in the intersection and hesitated for a moment. No other traffic was present. The subject's vehicle turned East on 4th Ave. As I followed the subject's vehicle East bound on 4th Ave the vehicle continued to weave within its lane of travel. The vehicle stopped at the stop sign at the intersection of 4th Ave and Milroy St and then continued. The subject's vehicle stopped at the stop sign at the intersection of 4th Ave and Thomas St and then continued down 4th Ave all the while weaving over the center line and back to the curb. At the intersection of 4th Ave and Percival I was able to place my vehicle in the path of the subject's vehicle and make contact with the driver who was a female. I identified myself as an off duty Deputy Sheriff with my badge and identification card. I spoke to the female driver through the window which was half way rolled down. I instructed the driver place the vehicle in park and to shut off the engine. As I spoke to the driver I noticed a moderate odor of alcohol coming from the driver, who was the only occupant in the vehicle. The driver's eyes, (Later identified as Romero), appeared to be glassy and Mrs Romero had a thousand yard stare. I instructed the driver three times to place the vehicle into park and stop the engine. Each

time Mrs Romero would continue to look at me with the thousand yard stare. Then on the third time I instructed Mrs Romero to turn off the vehicle, Mrs Romero made the statement to me, "I am fine" in a very calm voice. I again told her to stop the vehicle and she stated to me, "Not on your life" and asked me to move my vehicle. I told her again that I was a Deputy Sheriff and to turn off her vehicle. The female then put her vehicle into gear and drove around my vehicle and down the hill on 4th Ave at a high rate of speed. I got back into my vehicle and was able to catch up to the vehicle at the intersection of 4th Ave and Capitol Blvd where other Olympia units arrived. After an Olympia unit pulled in behind the subjects vehicle the female again accelerated and struck a vehicle which was stopped for the signal. I then approached Mrs Romero's vehicle and removed the keys from the ignition and instructed the Mrs Romero to exit the vehicle and turned her over to an Olympia officer.

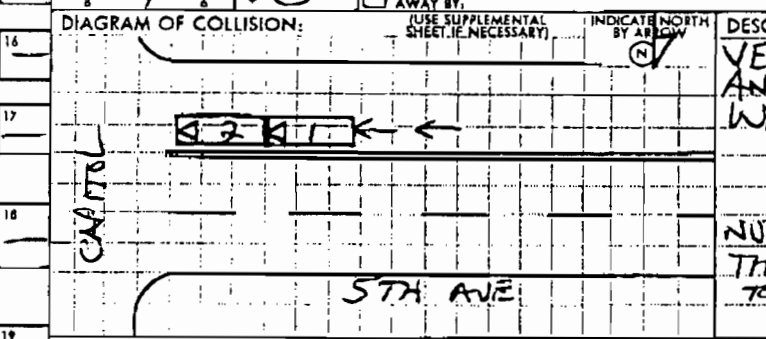
